**BIOGRAPHY**  
**JOHN A. DELANEY**

John A. Delaney became UNF's fifth president in 2003. In that capacity, he oversees a campus of more than 16,500 students, 600 faculty and more than 1,000 staff. The 1,300 acre campus in Northeast Florida is considered a driver in the region, with an annual economic impact of nearly \$1 billion. Each year, 4,000 students graduate from UNF's five colleges: the Brooks College of Health, the Coggin College of Business, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Computing, Engineering and Construction and the College of Education and Human Services.

Under Delaney's direction, UNF reaffirmed its commitment to students, by offering individualized attention and offering transformational learning opportunities. The University of North Florida is also known for its flagship programs, areas where UNF leads the nation. Flagships include Community Nursing, International Business, Transportation and Logistics and Coastal Biology.

UNF is currently undergoing the biggest construction spree in its history. The University is building an \$86 million residence hall, a \$50 million Student Union, a \$27 million College of Education and Human Services building and an \$11 million addition to the Brooks College of Health.

Delaney is considered UNF's chief fundraiser, nearly doubling the University's privately-funded endowment.

Delaney's presidency continues a distinguished career as a public servant. He served two terms as mayor of Jacksonville, the country's 13th largest city, spearheading major initiatives including The Better Jacksonville Plan, a \$2.2 billion improvement plan that gave the city new public facilities and other amenities. He also created the Preservation Project, a massive land conservation program giving Jacksonville the distinction of having the largest urban park system in the United States. Prior to that, he served as the chief assistant state attorney, the number two prosecutor for Northeast Florida and as the general counsel for the City of Jacksonville. He has served on numerous non-profit and corporate boards.

He and his wife Gena have four children.

Mia Jones

A native of Jacksonville, Mia Jones was re-elected to the City Council to represent District 10, in May 2007, for her second and final term. During her tenure on the Council she has shown herself to be a leader among her peers. Since arriving she served as Chair for both Rules (05-06) and Economic, Community & International Development (06-07); Vice Chair of Public Health & Safety (07-08), Rules (04-05) and the Special Committee on Legislative Issues (04-05). Additionally, Mia has served as Council Liaison to the Water & Sewer Expansion Authority, the Victim Assistance Advisory Council, the Jacksonville Economic Development Commission, the Duval County School Board and on the Election Canvassing Board during the Presidential Election of 2004.

Since being elected Mia Jones has remained true to her platform of Promoting Economic Development, Partnering in Education, both inside and outside of her district, Promoting a long term solution to Infrastructure Disparities and supporting activities that will increase the Safety of the citizens she represents. She introduced and successfully passed legislation that addressed: Voting Irregularities, Early Voting Sites, Rehabilitation, Conservation or Redevelopment of Blighted Areas and the Relocation of the Head Start Program from a contaminated site, to name a few.

Mia is the former Director, Minority Business Affairs for the Duval County Public Schools where she was responsible for ensuring the administration and development of the Minority Business Development and Assistance Program. Mia began her career with the Duval County Public Schools in 1995, as the Supervisor of Affirmative Action after serving as the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Assistant to the Mayor's Office of Equal Employment (1992-1995).

Mia Jones is the youngest of three children born to Lawrence and Hannah Jones. She was educated in the Duval County Public School System and graduated from William M. Raines Senior High School (Class of 1986). She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting and an MBA in Human Resource Management from Florida A & M University (FAMU). She is an active member at Bethel Baptist Institutional Church and she believes the most important thing one can do is to keep your priorities in perspective: Christ, Family and Community.

#### **Community and Civic Activities**

In March 2006, she co-founded and sponsored the Celebrate Life 5K Walk & Run along with the Johnson Family YMCA. This annual event places a spotlight of the need for the community to make positive life choices as it relates to their physical and mental health and wellbeing. Mia Jones enjoys golf and has hosted the Pink Lady Charity Golf Tournament, an event committed to supporting various non-profit programs that positively impact the lives of her constituents. She is a member of the Mary L. Singleton Memorial Breakfast Committee, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and Life Member of FAMU National Alumni Association.

# Nat Glover

**Nathaniel Glover, Jr.**, known as **Nat Glover** (born March 29, 1943), is an American college administrator and former police officer and sheriff. He is currently President of Edward Waters College in Jacksonville, Florida.<sup>[1]</sup> Previously he was Sheriff of Jacksonville from 1995–2003, after serving in the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office since 1966; he was the first African American elected sheriff in Florida since the end of Reconstruction.<sup>[2]</sup> He was succeeded by John Rutherford.

## Life and education

Glover was born and attended public schools in Jacksonville. As a young man he experienced the racism of the early 1960s when he stumbled into Ax Handle Saturday.<sup>[3]</sup> On that day, a group of 200 middle-aged and elderly white men, including some members of the Ku Klux Klan, gathered in Hemming Park, armed with axe handles and baseball bats, and attacked Civil rights protesters. A group of black youth who were called the "Boomerangs" attempted to protect the demonstrators.<sup>[4]</sup> Police, who had not intervened when the protesters were attacked, now became involved, arresting members of the Boomerangs and other black residents who had attempted to stop the beatings.<sup>[5][6][7]</sup> Glover said he ran to the police, expecting them to arrest the thugs, but was told to leave town or risk being killed.<sup>[3]</sup>

He graduated from Edward Waters College in 1966<sup>[8]</sup> and received a master's degree from the University of North Florida; he also graduated from the 130th Session of the FBI National Academy. Sheriff Glover was a starting linebacker and team captain for the Edward Waters College football team, where he was a teammate of Jim "Cannonball" Butler.

## Law enforcement career



Glover joined the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) in 1966, becoming an investigator in the Detective Division in 1969 and was promoted to Sergeant in 1974. In 1991, he was named Director of Police Services, one of the JSO's top positions. A political Democrat and a long-time police officer, Glover was elected Sheriff of Jacksonville in 1995, and was re-elected in 1999.

Glover was serving at the time of the Brenton Butler case in 2000, in which the 15-year-old Butler was falsely accused of murder.<sup>[9]</sup> Butler confessed to the crime, but later testified that two JSO detectives, including Nat Glover's son Michael Glover, had physically attacked and coerced him into confessing.<sup>[9]</sup> Butler was acquitted and the JSO and State Attorney's Office took the unusual step of apologizing to him.<sup>[9]</sup> Michael Glover, who denied the allegation, retired from the Sheriff's Office to become a private investigator.<sup>[10]</sup>

## Mayoral candidate and later life

In 2003, Nat Glover ran for Mayor of Jacksonville but was defeated by Republican candidate John Peyton, in the most expensive mayoral race in Jacksonville's history. An African-American had never served as mayor in Jacksonville, until Alvin Brown's election on May 19, 2011. Glover's campaign focused on education, economic development, and managing the city's growth. "Jacksonville is poised for greatness. I want to be the mayor that allows us to show the state how great we are", Nat Glover said.<sup>[11]</sup>

The campaign was briefly marred by racism; after Matt Carlucci, a white Republican candidate, endorsed Glover after being defeated in the open primary, his business was vandalized with racial slurs against Glover. Vandals also spray-painted racist graffiti on Glover's headquarters, though witnesses to the crime described the vandals of this incident as being black males.<sup>[12]</sup>

After retiring from the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Glover served on several boards, and was hired as a special adviser by University of North Florida President John Delaney, the former Mayor of Jacksonville.<sup>[1]</sup>

Glover and his wife Doris J. Bailey have two children, two grandsons and a granddaughter. He says his most admired people are Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Wright brothers.<sup>[3]</sup> Nat Glover stated "I always felt like if I could make the children and the senior citizens safe, everyone in between would be OK".<sup>[13]</sup>

## Edward Waters College

As a respected member of the community and an Edward Waters alumni, Glover always maintained a relationship with the college. Glover pledged to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity while completing his undergraduate studies. He served on the presidential search committee which was formed in 2005 after a plagiarism scandal led to accreditation problems and the resignation of President Jenkins.<sup>[14]</sup> That committee took two years to select Claudette Williams in 2007. Glover joined EW/C's Board of Trustees in 2008, and when Williams resigned effective May 15, 2010, Glover was quickly approved as interim president. In February 2011, the position was made permanent.<sup>[1]</sup>

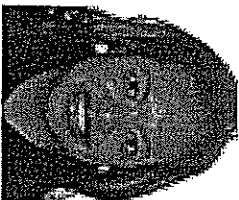

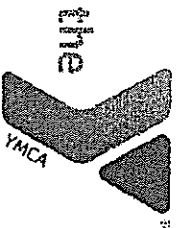
